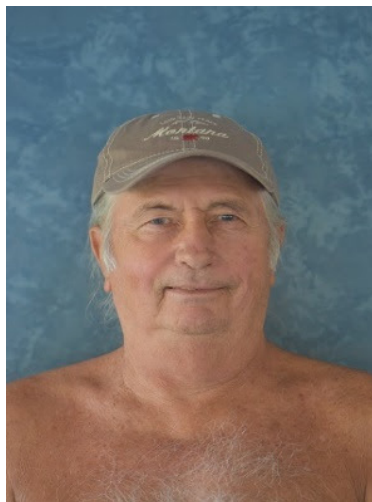

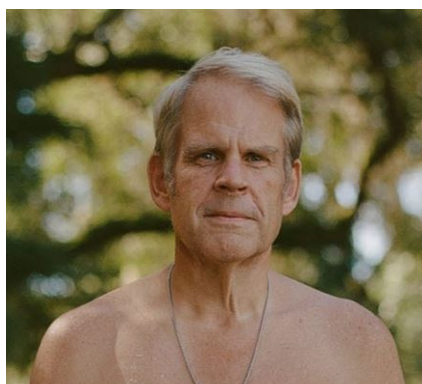
On the Government Affairs side, we are watching and tracking several bills currently winding their way through the Florida legislature. While the bills are not specifically aimed at naturists, they could have a negative side effect on our industry. The bills currently being watched deal with strict limitations on massage therapists who provide therapy to nude clients, children and nudity, and children and liquor being sold.

For you, beachgoers, be aware that there is a 5000 mile wide seaweed belt moving our way in the Atlantic. It is expected to begin washing ashore over the next few months on beaches in the Caribbean and South Florida. We have already seen evidence in the Key West area. While being a nuisance, it can also be a health hazard. As it decomposes it releases ammonia and hydrogen sulfide which produces the rotten egg odor. Prolonged exposure to this odor, especially for those with breathing problems, can be dangerous, so take proper caution.

Recently, I have become aware of two outstanding projects related to naturism. Both have been developed by Evan Nix who is a nudist historian, a member of AANR's PR Committee, a nudist advocate, and the Director of the Western Nudist Library. If you enjoy reading about the history of nudism and learning about current events impacting nudists, I recommend that you check out Planet Nude and Naked Age. Planet Nude is a newsletter that explores the diverse aspects of nudity in history, culture, activism, and art.

You can subscribe to Planet Nude at planetnude.co on substack.com. Naked Age is a nudist history podcast that explores the stories of individuals who have dedicated their lives to nude living. Florida Report

AANR, AANR Florida, and the naturist community are closely monitoring and responding to several bills pending within the state legislature.

FL HB 615 and SB 1338 propose additional limitations on massage establishments in an attempt to curb unlawful, illicit, conduct. However, some language is also restrictive of nudity. For example, it includes requirements to obtain written consent from a patient prior to giving a massage to persons in the nude.

The consent, as well as other information, would need to be kept on file. As such provisions are less workable in a nudist environment, where persons are already nude on grounds, Florida's government affairs professionals are working to revise the bill with amendments.

Meanwhile, FL SB 1438 would prohibit "performances" deemed "harmful to minors" when, for example, they are viewed as appealing to a prurient interest. While some of the language in the bill draws upon decades-old US Supreme Court decisions and other case law, the proposed penalties for violations and likelihood of enhanced enforcement are sobering. Presently your associations are working to get clarification of the language onto the recorded legislative history.

Sunsport Gardens is enjoying some of the best weather of the year with lots of sun and not too hot or cold weather. People are playing daily petanque, pickleball, and often volleyball. Water aerobics is Monday, Wednesday, and Friday at 10 am, line dancing is Tuesday at 9:30 am, and yoga is Thursdays at 10 am.

The annual Easter Egg Hunt for children will be on Sunday, April 9th. Children should meet on the restaurant deck at 11 am. As usual, a community drum circle will be on the first Friday, April 7th.

The World Naked Gardening Day and International Permaculture Day weekend is coming May 6 and 7, 2023. The schedule will include permaculture/gardening workshops and work projects that will benefit the Sunsport community. We expect the workshops and projects to run from 10 AM to 3 PM on Saturday and Sunday, with time off for lunch on the restaurant deck. The fee for all weekend events and daily ground fees is \$30, \$15 for Sunsport members.

The Full Bloom Weekend for Young Adults will be May 13-15. The entire weekend including tent camping will be \$20 for people ages 18-30. People of all ages are welcome to participate in the workshops and enjoy the music.

The costs of operating Sunsport have increased dramatically. Last year expenses well surpassed income. Therefore, the following adjustments are being instituted:

STORAGE

Beginning June 1, storage of trailers and RVs will be \$5.04 per foot per month with a minimum of \$151.28 per month. As usual, vehicles newly entering storage will pay first and last month's fees plus a \$300 deposit refundable when the vehicle is removed from storage.

GROUND FEES

Beginning April 1, daily ground fees will be \$30 or \$25 for individuals with current membership cards in TNSF, AANR, FQN, FCN, INF, or Bare Oaks. Ground fees for people aged 18-30 with student IDs or TNSF membership will be \$10. These ground fees will be year-round.

DRUM CIRCLES

Beginning May 1, the special ground fee for first Friday of the month community drum circles will be \$10 for people arriving between 5 pm and 10 pm. After 10 pm, when the office closes, the regular ground fee rates will apply.

ICE

Beginning April 1, the price for a bag of ice will be \$5.

MEAL SERVICE

Beginning May 1, the Smoothie Bar will be open Friday, Saturday, and Sunday 11 am to 1 pm and 5 pm - 7 pm for the summer. Smoothie Bar hours may differ for special events. Healthy food will be available daily in the office which is open 10 am - 6 pm. Be sure to pick up your food for dinner by 6 pm.

FIRST VISIT PASSES

First visit free passes may not be used during special events such as the Midwinter Naturist Festival, the Young Naturist Weekends, Community Drum Circles, the Family Young Naturist Gathering, or the Permaculture/ Nude Gardening Day Weekend. Passes may be downloaded from Sunsport's website.

ELECTRICITY CHARGES

Beginning April 1, the charge for electricity for metered sites will be changed to reflect the actual charge from Florida Power and Light. It has been less in the past. Beginning May 1, the charge for non-metered sites will also be adjusted.

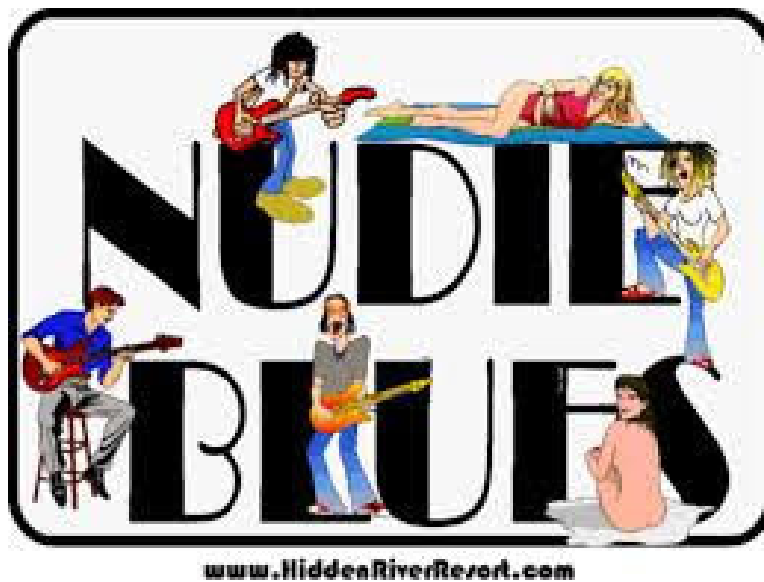
May is the month when lower summer rates for site rentals start.

The Sunsport Board has established a Nature Preserve area including the walking and golf cart nature trails through the jungle, the labyrinth, the permaculture project, the lotus pond, and the meditation field overlooked by a beautiful Buddha Head. The cart trail has been elevated to avoid flooding. The Serenity Garden near the office now has a waterfall, beautiful new plants, a small campfire area, a Buddha statue, and an aviary. This year's event is scheduled for **April 28-30, 2023**

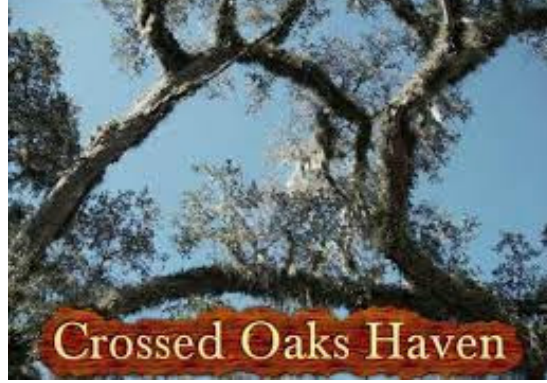
This fun-filled musical event happens with a Saturday night show on stage and under the stars with some classic rock and easy listening that will keep you in the groove.
