


I had a great time at SunSport Garden's 35th Annual Naturist Mid-Winter Festival talking about what has transpired in AANR-Florida's world in 2024. We have again dodged any negative legislation in Tallahassee. We have been very involved in a proposed massage bill and so far we have been successful in protecting massage therapy at AANR-affiliated resorts in Florida. Florida "Nakations" has also had a lot of success. Jack Clark and Maryanne Rettig from Florida "Nakations" joined me at SunSport Gardens to discuss their success at the Governor's Conference on Tourism in Florida in September and their recent participation in marketing Florida's naturist clubs and beaches at Visit Florida's Visitor Centers on I 95 and I 75.

Jack and Maryanne also updated the seminar participants on the latest developments with Tampa Bay Free Beaches (TBFB). TBFB's has made significant inroads with county officials in Pinelas County in 2023 and they are continuing their efforts into 2024 to secure a section of beach at Ft. DeSoto County Park as a dedicated clothing-optional beach. So far, all interactions with local officials have been positive. If you have not attended one of SunSport's Winter Festivals in the past, I strongly recommend it.

I believe it is the longest-running Naturist Festival in the country, hosting over 220 workshops on numerous subjects over President's Day Week each year.

- An individual can be nominated or self-nominated for a Board or officer position.

• The President and Vice President must be a member in good standing for 2 years immediately preceding nomination who, at the time of nomination, holds an AANR membership through an AANR-Florida club or the AANR-Florida Associates plus 1-year minimum experience as a Board member or elected officer.

 \cdot Board members must be a member in good standing for 2 years immediately preceding nomination who, at the time of nomination, holds an AANR membership through an AANR-Florida

club or the AANR-Florida Associates.

• All AANR-Florida Board members and officers must have an official place of residence that is within the geographical boundaries of the AANR-Florida Region or no more than 100 miles from the AANR Florida boundaries.

• The Board of Directors conducts the business of AANR-Florida during the period between summer and mid-winter meetings of the Regional Assembly.

The Midwinter Naturist Festival was a great success. There were over 220 activities. Many thanks to

the workshop leaders, the Sunsport volunteers, and the Sunsport staff who worked long hours to produce a smooth-running and stimulating Festival. Contributions from the Festival registration fee will go to the Naturist Society Foundation, South Florida Free Beaches (Haulover Beach), and Treasure Coast Naturists (Blind Creek Beach). As always, the Festival was six days of fun, growth, and community.

The Annual Coed Volleyball Tournament on February 25th was lots of fun. It is unique in that players are a member of a different team for each game. Vickie Wesby and Mike Patchkowski were crowned queen and king for totaling the most points in the games in which they played.

Many people volunteer at Sunsport; their help is valuable and builds community. Sunsport hosted a volunteer appreciation dessert party near the end of February. All people who helped with the Festival, construction projects, or any activity were thanked. Speaking of volunteers, they have largely cleared the pond near the gazebo and the canal of invasive plants. Particular thanks to Allen Wesby for his extensive work.

Many activities are planned for March. There will be a community drum circle on Friday, March 1st. Dance to the music of the Blue Crusaders Band poolside on Saturday, March 2nd. Also on March 2nd will be a petanque tournament.

Ongoing activities include Tuesday morning line dancing, Monday, Wednesday, and Friday morning water aerobics, Saturday evening dances, arts and crafts on Wednesdays at 2 pm in the pavilion, yoga on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday at noon in the pavilion, and canasta Monday evenings at 7 pm in the clubhouse. Continuing are daily pickleball in the morning and volleyball and petanque in the afternoon.

Lot rents will be increased by 30% beginning April 1st. This is necessary because operating expenses have increased dramatically, particularly propane, electricity, water, supplies such as pool chemicals, taxes, and insurance.

Harvesting produce from fruit trees and plants at Sunsport is restricted. It is OK to pick a piece of fruit to eat while passing by, but not multiple pieces. Don't climb in the trees to pick fruit. Also, please do not pick flowers; they are for all to enjoy. Thank you for your cooperation.

Coming up will be a "Plant-Based Retreat, A Healing Weekend In Tropical Paradise" April 12-15. The cost is \$150 plus \$30 for non-Sunsport members or anyone tent camping. Call 914-886-3148 for information.
